Essential Duties

Provides therapy, case management, clinical and medical social work services to patients at CHCB's Safe Harbor Clinic as part of a medical team. Conducts rapid assessment, diagnosis, provides brief counseling support and longer-term psychotherapy, medical case management, crisis interventions and behavioral medicine interventions. Conducts social work consultations in order to assess mental health and substance abuse disorders and makes treatment recommendations. Assists with accessing benefits and resources including health and disability insurance, WIC, transportation and other resources as needed.

Basic Qualifications

- Masters Degree in Social Work from a school accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE).
- Minimum 3 years of clinical practice experience.
- Licensed as an independent clinical social worker in the State of Vermont.
- Certification/Licensure in drug and alcohol counseling (or willingness to become licensed).
- Knowledge of social work standards & ethics.
- Knowledge of cognitive-behavioral, behavioral medicine and other evidence-based approaches.
- Understanding of mind/body and Biopsychosocial implications of health, and transference/countertransference.
- Experience with addictions assessment and treatment.
- Strong diagnosis, assessment, psychotherapy, case management and crisis intervention skills.
- Knowledge of mental health and substance abuse laws and regulations.
- Strong written and verbal skills; good organizational and problem solving skills.
