CHC – Champlain Islands Dental **Center Opening Spring 2024**

In 2021, Senator Patrick Leahy's office presented a golden opportunity to apply for \$1 million in congressionally directed spending for rural health service expansions, and we are now using the awarded funds to create a complete Dental Center in South Hero next Spring! Northeast Delta Dental has also generously committed to helping us build these five dental operatories within our existing space in the CHC – Champlain Islands building's lower level. This new dental center will provide the local Islands community the convenience and access to affordable, quality oral health services.

This pilot is just one day per month at the moment, but there is such a vital clinical need for patients to receive care outside of a traditional outpatient setting, we're hopeful it will become a sustainable model.

WISH LIST \$10,000 **Dental Items**

New and replacement instruments and equipment are always needed in our Dental Center: • Dental Endodontic System for advanced dental treatment with specialty tools - **\$2,000** • Dental Instruments/Equipment for use at the Green Mountain Surgery Center (GMSC), a new anesthetic service that we are able to provide for our adult special needs population - **\$2,000** • Patient anesthesia stipend, also for the new service we provide at GMSC when insurance doesn't cover the operating room fee - **\$4,000** • Dental Hand Instruments for hygiene and restorative services - \$2,000

Site Updates for At-Risk Youth

Our CHC - Pearl Street practice, that serves at-risk and/or homeless youth, was damaged by unexpected flooding and requires new flooring. This update is needed to create and maintain a warm and welcoming feel for the young people coming in for care.

Distraction Toys for Laboratory \$1.500

Our pediatric patients sometimes have upsetting times getting their blood drawn in our laboratories. It would be helpful to have a supply of toys to help distract them, and then give them a prize to help them recover when it's all over.

Bus Passes for Patients

Many of our patients rely on the bus system to get to and from their appointments. This will provide 100 bus passes.

Nursing **Education Items** \$2,000

The Nursing Education Program implements, designs, assesses, and modifies the clinical training for our nursing staff in ord<u>er for</u> them to achieve excellency in providing evidencedbased nursing care in the clinical setting. Needed items include a CPR manikin, skin and vein replacement kits, and phlebotomy arm tubing sealant to name a few.

Portable Automatic Vital Sign Machines \$1,600 each

Eight machines are needed to allow clinical staff to verify hard to read/hear vitals and can be used in emergency situations where vital signs need to be consistently monitored.

Managing the Baby Blues Even in the ever-changing environment that is health care, CHC remains consistent in providing accessible, quality medical, dental, and mental health care to all our patients. An excellent example of this integrated care model at work is CHC's Maternal/ Child Health Program. Physicians, Medical Assistants and Mental Health Clinicians work together to ensure expecting parents and our tiniest patients receive the care they need. Lincoln Heath, MD, has been working on CHC's OB Team since 2015 and expressed the following: "Mental Health Clinicians are an integral part of our team and provide an immense amount of assistance with mental health screening and support, and case management needs. We are uniquely designed to care for folks with limited resources, and we

prioritize ensuring that we connect Taking all of this into people to social support systems and make sure their families have food security, housing stability, and reliable transportation."

CHC's patient population in this program, compared to others in Vermont, is 48% limited-English speaking (compared to 7%), with 8% experiencing homelessness (roughly double), and 88% Medicaid enrolled (also about double).



consideration, CHC's average PHQ-9 score (a patient health questionnaire specifically designed to measure depression rates) is still less than half that of the comparison group, despite this patient population having statistically higher rates of depression overall. "One of the reasons why our PHQ-9 scores are so low," commented Dr. Heath, "is that we are screening everybody, not just those with pre-existing depression, to ensure that we are identifying anyone who is at risk for perinatal mood disorder."

It is a collaborative effort to provide wraparound care from the moment an expecting parent walks through our doors and throughout their postpartum period – no matter who they are and what they need.
